OUR PASTOR'S INSTALLATION

A pastor's installation mass is not likely to be in the liturgical consciousness of St. Mary Parishioners. Fr. Justin Zawadski was installed as pastor under the auspices of Bishop Pierre DuMaine before I was ordained and served this community for 19 years. An installation mass only occurs when the bishop appoints a new pastor. According to the liturgical rubrics of the Roman Church, "When a new pastor is appointed for a parish it is appropriate that he be publicly installed by a liturgical rite (#2012 Book of Blessings).

As much as I know what this means by practice and experience, I do not understand the use of the word "installation." It seems better used for an object like an appliance or flooring. I hardly think of myself as flooring. Once upon inviting one my friends to my first installation mass, he asked if he should bring his tools. Obviously, it is important to contextualize the word to understand its meaning. To be installed by a liturgical rite as pastor of a parish is a public celebration of an appointment that—in my case—took place over 3 months ago.

Now under the aegis of Bishop Patrick McGrath, we are celebrating this installation mass. I am very honored to serve among you as pastor, and I am edified by the many who serve this community unreservedly. Our work is made all the better by the gifts you bring to bear for the common good of St. Mary and the people of Los Gatos.

Even as write about this installation mass, I am fully aware of the duties and challenges that the office of pastor presents me, and I accept them as once I accepted my ordination to priesthood; with faith that God is indeed with us. I am relieved to know that I am not the first but merely one of many in nearly 100

years. This is the way parish life works: Pastors will come and go, but the people remain and grow as members of Christ's Body—their faith rooted deeply in this community.

In 2012, St. Mary will celebrate its centennial anniversary. With 100 years of service and ministry and still much to be done, we await the continued grace of God among us, and we pray that God's Kingdom come. In the fullness of time, may we grow to the newness of everlasting life by learning to love as our Lord Jesus has loved us. As I begin this pastorate among you, may the same promise of eternal life be with us now and always. Thank you for welcoming me to St. Mary Parish. I pray that God will grant me the grace to serve you well.

PARISHIONER SPOTLIGHT

Carol Thornton

By this point most St. Mary's teens and their parents have noticed that WAV, our High School Youth Ministry program, has changed its meeting time from 7-8:30 p.m. Sunday (after the 6 p.m. mass) to 4:30-6 p.m. This change has been met with delight within the St. Mary's community, because it allows families with teenagers to have their Sunday nights back for dinner together, or other family activities.

The meeting time change and other thoughtful developments in WAV this year are due to the efforts of Carol Thornton, St. Mary's Director of Youth Ministry for the last seven years.

"I direct [WAV], but with input from the Core Team" Carol explained. "The Core Team is comprised of teenagers and young adults, and some adults. We plan for a whole season at a time, so by the end of August we had September to December planned. As we move through the season we make adjustments based on the needs of our Youth Ministry group."

There are three major themes this year which they are planning on working on simultaneously: (1) Build community! This is actually a larger theme at St. Mary's (have you noticed that we now "introduce" ourselves to our neighbors at the start of mass, rather than simply say hello?) and Carol and the Core Team are working at building a "welcoming and comfortable parish youth community." (2) Community Service - "As a community we want to reach out and help communities around us," Carol said. This season students will work with the Santee Mission in East San Jose and the Working Boys Mission of Ecuador. And of course, (3) the Word of God. "We are going to break open the gospel, to better understand the message of Jesus."

Carol's enthusiasm for her work is infectious. "What made you want to do Youth Ministry?" I asked.

"My family and I moved here to Los Gatos in 2000 from New York City, and after we settled in I looked around to re-enter the work force. I saw in the bulletin that St. Mary's needed a part time

helper for Pastoral Care and Community Ministry. After the third time I saw it, I called Jane [Ferguson]. That's how I came to do ministry work. I had never thought of working in a church before, but I loved it here."

When the former Director of Youth Ministries was leaving she came to Carol and suggested that she should apply for the position. "So I prayed," Carol told me, "Am I really called to be a Youth Minister? Dear God, what do I have to offer? What can I bring to this? But it was something I thought I'd want to try... And to my delight I found the young people are wonderful! This is my seventh year, and it has been a fun and energizing faith experience."

FATHER RICK RODONI'S INSTALLATION AS PASTOR

Father Rick officially resumed his office of pastor on July 1st and this Saturday the community of St. Mary in Los Gatos joins together to celebrate the his installation as Pastor at the 5 o'clock in the evening Mass on Saturday this weekend. The Most Reverend Patrick J. McGrath, Bishop of San Jose, is the presider. Father Rick is the principal celebrant. Concelebrating with Fr. Rick are Fr. Hao Dinh, dean of Deanery 5, Fr. Justin Le, our parish parochial vicar, and other priest friends of the new pastor.

This Saturday's celebration of the Mass of Installation of Pastor is a custom that has taken place only since the Second Vatican Council. The Rite of Installation, which takes place at the Installation Mass, is rich in meaning. As a dean, Fr. Hao first reads the Letter of Appointment, emphasizing that the new pastor has arrived, not of his own will, but has been chosen and sent by the Church. Bishop McGrath then presents Fr. Rick to the community and invites the people of God at St. Mary's parish to express support of the new pastor and welcome him. This is followed by the homily given by the new pastor, in which he explains the meaning of the celebration.

After the homily, the Bishop then presents to the new pastor his fellow clergy, Fr. Justin, who will work with him in the parish, as well as members and leaders of the Parish Pastoral, Finance, Liturgy, and Spirituality Councils. This is a significant symbol: Fr. Rick begins shepherding our community parish with the assistance of his parochial vicar, the staff, the lay leaders, and other lay ministers. As the bishop says, "these brothers and sisters will assist [Fr. Rick] in the pastoral care of the people of this parish." The bishop also invites the new pastor to "share this ministry in a spirit of mutual trust, praying with them, caring for this community together, and working with them to make this church a sign of the kingdom of God." On the parishioners' part, the bishop invites the people of Saint Mary to "pray for Father Rick, assist him in his ministry, and sincerely welcome him into this community."

Next, it comes the Profession of Faith

and Oath as the bishop reminds the new pastor to be always "a loving father, a gentle shepherd" and especially "a teacher of faith". As a pastor, Fr. Rick leads our Saint Mary's community in our profession of the faith (Nicene Creed) that binds us to Christ, to the Church, and to one another. At the conclusion of this profession, Fr. Rick makes a public oath, promising to uphold his office of teaching, preaching, and living the faith in complete union and fidelity to the Church as he "firmly accepts and holds each and every thing that is proposed by the Church definitely regarding teaching on faith and morals." After making the Oath, the bishop leads the new pastor to the presidential chair as it symbolically shows that Fr. Rick is now the pastor of Saint Mary of the Immaculate Conception parish.

By Fr. Rick's installation as pastor, we at Saint Mary's parish give praise and thanks to our Good and Gracious God for providing us with the new pastor who comes to shepherd and unite all of us "together in Christ." We ask for God's continued blessings and the prayers of Mary, the Immaculate Conception, for our pastor Father Rick Rodoni and our entire parish community. Fr. Rick: multos annos!

BREAKING OPEN THE GOOD NEWS *The Message of the Gospel*

Last week we shared information on one of our WAV goals for the year, "Building Community". This week I'd like to introduce another one of our goals, "Breaking Open the Word". Our plan is to spend time each Sunday at WAV listening to the Gospel of the day to see what message it has for each of us. It will be a time of simple reflection, not a bible study, but it is our hope that the more we listen to the Word of God, the more it will touch our hearts and minds. When we gather at 6:00 pm mass and hear the same Word proclaimed, we'll have another opportunity to receive the grace and blessing imbedded in the sacred text.

As a Catholic Christian community our basic beliefs, our creed and doctrine, flow from scripture and liturgy. The Bible is the first expression of our beliefs, and so can be our map, guiding our journey into greater faith. Week by week, we gather together to share both Word and Eucharistic. We are then sent out to take what we have received into the world. Our priests close each mass with the

words, "Go forth to serve the Lord and one another." As we do, we find that our doctrine, our sacramental life and our commitment to our neighbor all flow from the Word of God.

The sacraments, too, flow from scripture. Because Jesus breaks bread and drinks wine with his disciples, and because he asks us to return again and again to this moment when heaven and earth meet, we do. Because our Lord is baptized and commissions us to baptize, we do. Many of our prayers are sourced in scripture – the prayer that Jesus taught us, "Our Father, who art in heaven..." is found in Matthew 6: 9-13 and Luke 11: 2-4. The

first part of the Hail Mary is from Luke 1: 28 and the second from Luke 1: 42.

The Sunday Gospels challenge us, week by week, to work out ways to take what we have heard into our everyday lives. May we have hearts and ears to hear!

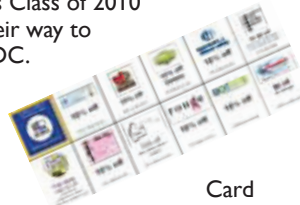
